Come be a part of this exciting program through Special Olympics Illinois. The Young Athletes program is an innovative sports play program for children ages 2-7 with and without intellectual disabilities, designed to introduce them into the world of sports. This program will prove enormously beneficial on multiple levels for your child including helping the children improve physically, cognitively and socially. This program is designed to address two specific levels of play. Level 1 includes physical activities focused on developing fundamental motor tracking and eyehand coordination. Level 2 concentrates on the application of these physical activities through a sports skills activity program and developing skills consistent with Special Olympics sports play. The activities will consist of foundational skills. walking & running, balance & jumping, trapping & catching, throwing, striking, kicking and advanced skills. Siblings ages 2–7 of the participants are welcome to participate. We are very excited about this program and your family's participation!

# Beyond "Behaviors": Supporting Confidence, Competence, and Well-Being

This workshop examines ways that we can help the person served to achieve a sense of confidence, competence, and a sense of well-being. This day-long workshop examines strategies for supporting not only an individual who experiences disabilities but also the needs of his or her caregivers. David will talk about how behaviors are "messages" which can tell us important things about an individual's life and how learning to listen to behaviors is the first step in helping the individual to find a new, healthier story. Come and learn how to listen for and understand the messages in your child's or your student's behavior.

David Pitonyak, PhD, has spent many years working with individuals who experience disabilities. Much of his work has focused on individuals who exhibit difficult behaviors because they are misunderstood and/or because they are living lives that don't make sense. He is a contributing editor for, "The Community Journal," a disability rights newsletter that focuses on building community and is President of the Commonwealth Coalition for Community, a grass roots effort to improve services for people with disabilities and their families in Virginia.
